Inpatient care

If it has been recommended that your pet be admitted to the surgery for investigation or treatment, you can rest assured that they will be well looked after.

At Parkside, we pride ourselves in the high quality care we offer to hospitalized patients through our dedicated team of vets and nurses, supported by cutting edge monitoring equipment and facilities.

What happens if my pet needs to be admitted?

Following a clinical examination, if it is felt that your pet would benefit from further investigation, your vet will discuss the proposed treatment plan and answer any questions you may have.

A suitable contact telephone number will be obtained so we can provide regular updates throughout your pets stay with us.

Following admission by the vet, you may be contacted by a member of the inpatient nursing team to discuss your pet's usual feeding and toileting habits, so we can maintain a normal routine as much as possible. This is especially true if an extended stay in hospital is expected.

Overnight care

If your pet is to remain in the surgery overnight, care will transfer to the Vets Now Emergency team who provide a dedicated out-of-hours emergency and critical care service for pets.
